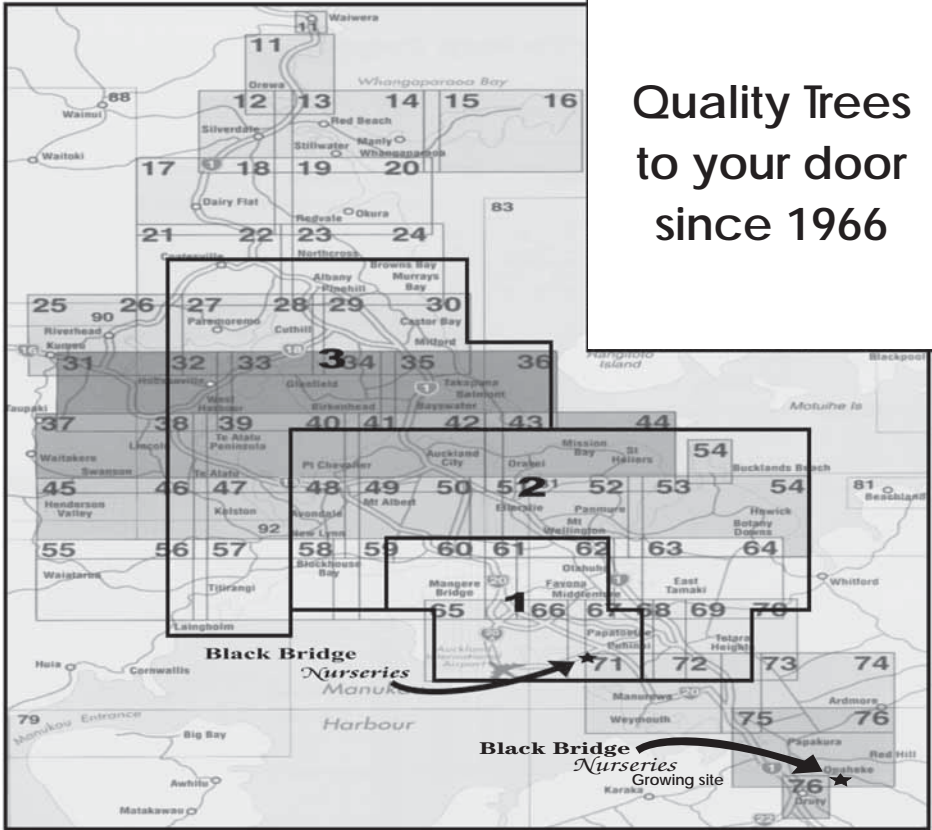

Magnolia (Deciduous)
