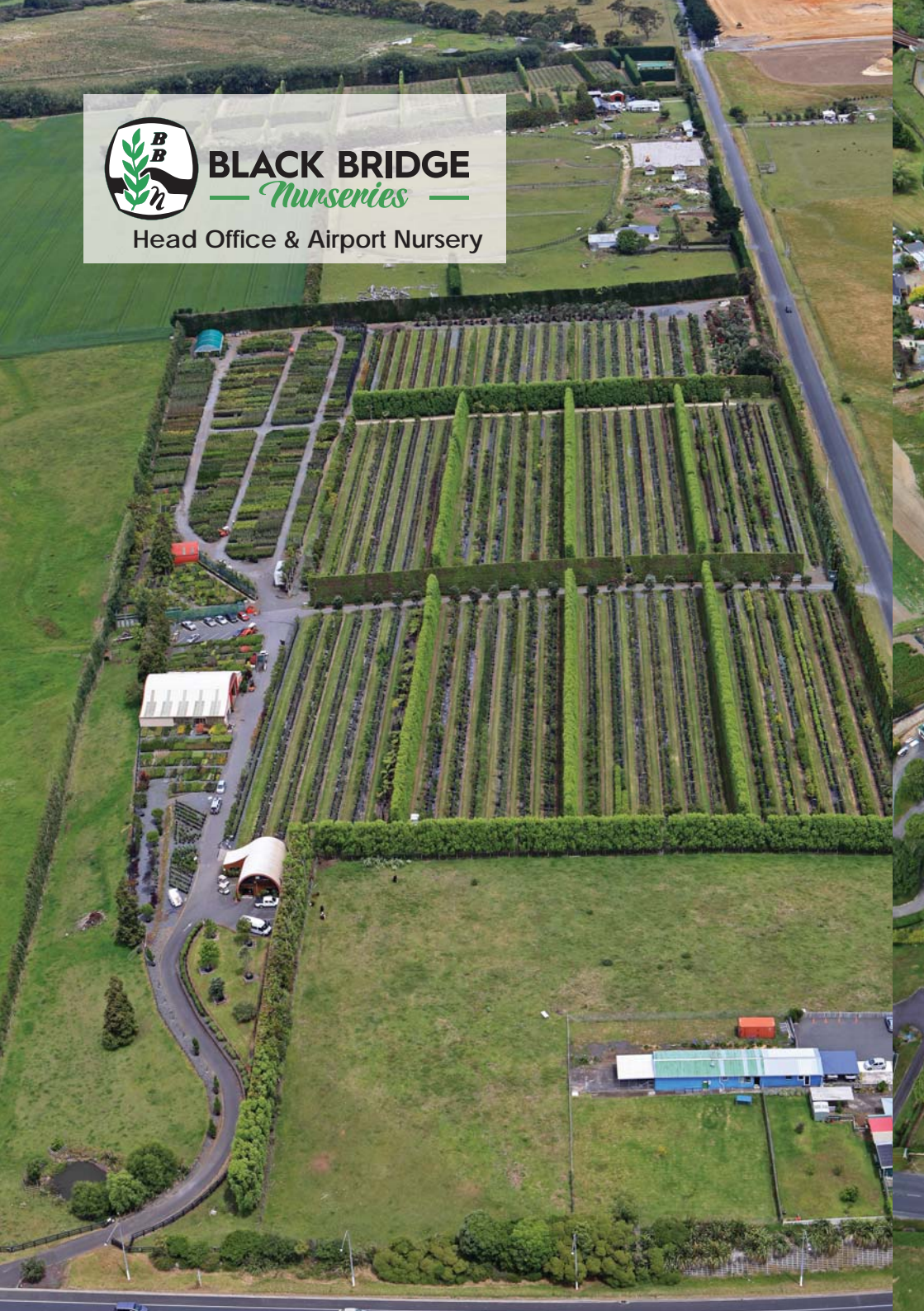

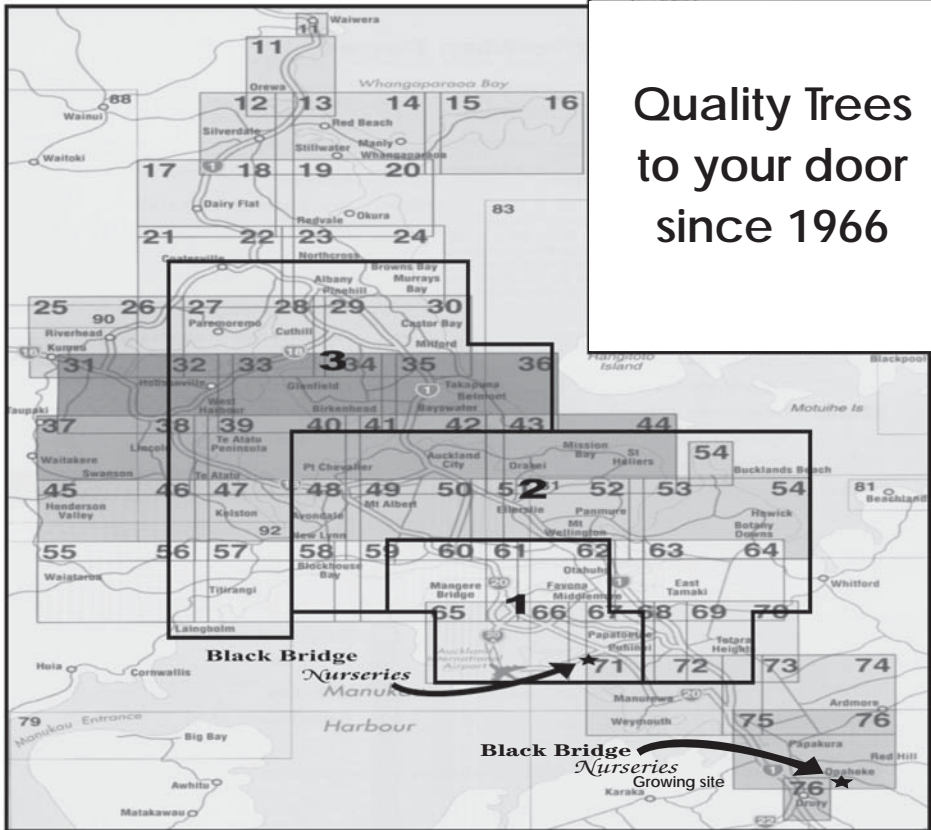

- Prune to shape and allow sunlight & wind movement.
- Rootstock growth needs to be removed.
- Citrus are 'gross feeders' so require regular fertilizing.
- Keep well -watered when fruit is developing
- Fruit can be left on the tree, but watch for over ripening.
- Citrus are self-fertile
- Fruit are best cut, not pulled, from the tree.
- Generally grow to 3 - 4m

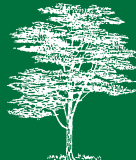
